



Office Based Opioid Treatment Fellowship Program for Clinical Providers and Practice Managers who Serve Medicaid Beneficiaries with Opioid Use Disorder

OVERDOSE DEATHS ARE PREVENTABLE; ADDICTION TREATMENT SAVES LIVES.

Through funding from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), DMMA is offering a *stipend-sponsored*, specialized training to equip participants with the knowledge and skills to manage patients with opioid use disorder through self-paced modules, live discussions, and facilitated webinars.

The **Office-Based Opioid Treatment (OBOT) Fellowship Program** is a unique opportunity to take part in specialized training to:

- Learn from addiction medicine experts
- Exchange ideas through a peer network
- Receive technical assistance to offer OBOT
- Gain access to a curated online library of tools and evidence-based practices

Delaware's OBOT Fellowship program provides stipends for participants—\$3,000 for clinical providers and \$2,000 for practice managers—with assistance through two tracks:

CLINICAL TRACK

For physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants, to build knowledge and skills for effectively assessing and treating opioid use disorder in the outpatient setting.

PRACTICE IMPLEMENTATION TRACK

For practice managers and clinical staff who advance operational and administrative aspects of their OBOT program, to provide guidance for developing effective workflows and infrastructure.

Designed to accommodate participants' schedules, the fellowship will run from February 23, 2021, to September 23, 2021, via an online learning portal. Training sessions range from 30 minutes to 4 hours per week, depending on the phase of the Fellowship.

Training Objectives:

- Integrate evidence-based opioid use disorder treatment into your care with a financially sustainable approach
- Increase your ability to provide whole person care and improve physical health outcomes for patients with opioid use disorder
- Facilitate easier treatment access and reduce fragmented care for patients with opioid use disorder
- Strengthen network and partnership with specialty behavioral health organizations
- Support overdose prevention and recovery
